Chairman's Report: Mr. Dale Hicks, Outlook, Saskatchewan

2014 proved to be a challenging year again for winter wheat. The crop came through another long winter in good shape, average yields, but delayed maturity, as with all crops. The long wet harvest was not good conditions for winter wheat seeding and we ended up with similar acres as last year, which is about half of the normal. Reduced tonnage is making it more difficult for our 2 member organizations (WCMI and SWCDC) to fund winter wheat research, but all the commitments to agronomy and breeding research, and the marketing efforts with Cigi will continue as planned. Good financial planning by the board and our executive director means that Winter Cereals Canada, is in a good position to continue co-ordinating winter wheat research on the Canadian prairies

The interest in winter wheat remains strong, and acres will rise again given a normal fall, so planning for the 2015 season should begin now. For growers that seed many acres of canola, consideration should be given to new earlier maturing canola varieties that yield well and assist you with swath timing to space out swathing and allow some canola to be harvested earlier. The early canola stubble can be seeded to winter wheat earlier. Plan now to have extra seed treatment available instead of hunting for it in fall and make arrangements to have fertilizer on hand or at the retail outlet nearby. Since acres have been down, be sure to line up seed supplies early as seed could be in short supply next fall. Should anyone out there have questions, feel free to call, and may 2015 be a great year on your farm.

Executive Managers Report: Mr. Jake Davidson

In 2014 WCC continued to operate in a support roll for Winter Cereals Manitoba Inc. and the Saskatchewan Winter Cereals Development Commission. As the umbrella organization WCC continued to act as coordinator for issues of common interest between the two separate provincial bodies. WCC organizes annual and director meetings and publishes the member newsletter, The Winter Cereals Grower three times a year. WCC continued to co-ordinate involvement of both groups in the critical work underway with the WGRF and the future of wheat and barley research, WCCI coordinated our participation in Growing Forward II funding for more advanced agronomy research. In addition WCC is coordinating work on funding gene marker research at the University of Saskatchewan.

All levy paying members of the provincial organizations have automatically become members of Winter Cereals Canada Inc. for the last 4 years. The two provincial groups have specific provincial responsibilities and act under very different provincial regulations. By combining membership groups together under Winter Cereals Canada Inc. we have a unified voice for approximately 7,000 winter cereals producers. Winter Cereals Canada acting as an umbrella service organization provides services to both organizations and also acts as a clearing house for discussions with organizations such as the grain companies, CIGI, AAFC, provincial ministry of agriculture departments and the Canadian Grains Commission.

This unified approach by the 2 independent provincial bodies and Winter Cereals Canada Inc. minimizes overhead costs, co-ordinates policies and activities and publishes a joint communications vehicle, the Winter Cereals Grower.
